
This Adventure Guide has activities—including reading! for all to enjoy. Let's follow our curiosity and go on this Summer Adventure together!

What is Summer Adventure and how can I participate?

Follow your curiosity to complete the activities in this guide in a way that works best for you. You can do as many activities as you want and even invent your own! After you finish an activity, submit it online, by mail, or in person. You'll get a free book gift for your first submission and be entered into the prize drawings (see page 4 for full submission and prize info).

- Complete any activity in this guide
- Read anything, or have someone read to you, as an activity
- Surprise us by creating your own activity
- Get inspired by a fellow adventurer from the Submission Showcase (aclibrary.org/summer) and reinterpret their idea in your own way as an activity. For example, if someone submitted a drawing you like, recreate it as a video, poem, story, etc.

Activities are meant to be adapted for any adventurer. Interpret, create, complete, and present them in your own way. There are no wrong answers!

Example Activity:

- Use your senses to connect to the world around you
 - To do this activity, you could:






